

DIOCESAN BOARD OF EDUCATION

FUNCTIONS

- i. To promote or assist in the promotion of education in the Diocese, being education which is consistent with the faith and practice of the Church of England.
- ii. To promote or assist in the promotion of religious education and religious worship in schools in the Diocese.
- iii. To promote or assist in the promotion of church schools in the Diocese and to advise the Governors of such schools and trustees of church educational endowments and any other body or person concerned on any matter affecting church schools in the Diocese.
- iv. To promote co-operation between the Board and bodies or persons concerned in any respect with education in the Diocese;
- v. The functions assigned to the Board by the Diocesan Boards of Education Measure 1991 being functions relating to church schools or church educational endowments.

COMPOSITION

Ex-Officio, nominated and co-opted

The Diocesan Bishop

Two persons nominated by the Diocesan Bishop being Suffragan Bishops or Archdeacons

Two other persons nominated by the Diocesan Bishop

Up to 8 co-opted members

Elected

14 elected members of whom:

6 must be members of the Diocesan Synod

2 must be clerks in Holy Orders beneficed or licensed in the Diocese

6 must be lay persons

NOTE

Not all elected members need be Synod members. However, they must be nominated by members of the Diocesan Synod.

FREQUENCY OF MEETINGS

There are three meetings held usually on Fridays.
