Welcome

- How do we respond to news of seemingly unlikely things?
- Do we tend to look for reasons to doubt or are we open to being plesantly surprised?

Word:

Luke 2: 8-20

So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.



Word (Cntd)

- In what way is the inclusion of the shepherds in the story significant?
- How should we look for signs of Christ in the world?
- Are we good at receiving gifts? Are we good at receiving God's gifts?
- Is it possible for the poor to be generous?

Reflect on how Luke presents the Shepherds, the poorest of the poor, as vital witnesses.

Reflect on the themes of the poor and marginised, and spend time praying for those in your own community who fall into these groups
