Training for Authorised Lay Ministry

Training for ALMs is provided in-house

Some Important Points

Authorisation as a Lay Minister is *not* a requirement for active involvement in Christian mission and ministry in the Diocese of Lincoln...

...but safe recruitment is a requirement for most ministerial roles...

...and there are some roles for which licensing or authorisation is required.

Training through St Hild, Lincoln is not mandatory for Lincoln ordinands





Training for Ordained Ministry

Since Autumn 2023 our 'preferred supplier' is St Hild, Lincoln

Training for Reader Ministry

The Diocese of Lincoln offers degree-level training to all Reader candidates

As with candidates for ordination, this is offered through St Hild, Lincoln

Candidates benefit from a balance of online and in-person training

Some Important Points

St Hild, Lincoln is a partnership between St Hild College and the Diocese of Lincoln

It is not the same thing as the College of St Hugh, which is a Department of the DBF

Lincoln Ordinands and Reader candidates are no longer trained 'in-house'.

The Lincoln School of Theology no longer exists

Training through St Hild, Lincoln is not mandatory for Lincoln ordinands



Training for Curates (aka IME2)

Training for Curates is provided in-house, although some curates may also undertake further study at St Hild, Lincoln, e.g. to complete a BA or MA

Mostly monthly in person in Lincoln, with annual residential

Training for Focal Ministers

Twice yearly programme: two whole days in person plus four evenings on Zoom

Two cohorts now trained

Training for CYF

Catalyst – 7 people have graduated in the first cohort. Another cohort begins...

ALM CYF module piloted and being finalised

Plus tons of networking events for mutual reflection, learning and encouragement
