"The Youthscape **Prayer Band** is a fantastic new way to help young people develop the practice of daily prayer. It's a physical and practical reminder of six types of prayer with the simple challenge to complete the circle - and all six prayers - through each day.

The Prayer Band has five different coloured beads, and a small silver cross. Each marks an approach to prayer drawn from Christian tradition and Scripture. Confession - Praise - Our world - Friends and family - Me - Listening to God.

Sometimes it's hard for young people to find the words to pray - which is why The Prayer Band comes with a fold out resource with eighteen prayers to get them started, together with some inspiration from great Christian writers about the power of prayer."



"Gospels in Schools and The Old Testament in Schools

Introduce your pupils to passages from the Gospels and the Old Testament and go deeper into well-known stories with these class discussion resources for KS1 and KS2.

- useful background information to contextualise each passage and support you in your planning and preparation


Young people are increasingly being radicalised online into having extreme and harmful views. Young people with autism can be especially vulnerable.

This year's lecture will explore a vision for leadership that seeks to hold power and authority differently, not as assumed but through deep attentiveness to the other, acknowledging that the humanity of each person bears the image of Christ.

Informed by the Christian tradition of non-violent practice this will encourage those who lead in the youth ministry space to consider reframing leadership as a spiritual practice of attentiveness.
