"It was with some trepidation that when asked to take on the catering role for our Bumps and Buggies group here at St. Anne's Grantham, my wife and I decided to give it a go.

The group leader Rhys gave us a free hand to go ahead in a way that we were comfortable - a great decision.

We are astonished to find the great joy and sense of fulfilment this has given us.

We serve simple things, toast, crumpets, fruit and biscuits, and a variety of drinks. Yet the pleasure and happiness that both the mums and children show as they are served their items is a truly joyful thing.



We had one clear aim when taking on this role - if the Lord walked through the door would what we offered to Him be any different than that served to any one else? The answer has to be no, to serve His children is to serve the Lord Himself and that means aspiring to give the best we can.

Hebrews 13 v2 says "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it" we appreciate that not all children can be described as "angels"!

However, giving of our best is surely a practical way for showing Jesus' love for everyone."




Thy Kingdom Come







Godly Play is a Christian movement centred on childhood spirituality. It recognises childhood spirituality as an instinctive and profound capacity that includes a natural sense of God's mystery and presence. It promotes open, creative ways to explore Christian story and practices, and offers a well-tested alternative to seeing children as empty vessels, and to the stressful societal cultures of consumerism, measurement and achievement.

It is hoped that a network for Godly Play Storytellers in South Lincolnshire & Peterborough will be launched after this training.
