



Growing Faith seeks to put children and young people at the heart of all we do, bringing together the spheres of church, school and community.


Whether exploring, just starting out or well on your way, everyone is invited to join our half-termly zoom meetings to connect with others on their Growing Faith journeys.


"A launch of a new Church initiative and booklet: [A Guide to Teddy and Dolly Church](#) is finally here!

Films that make faith conversations possible.



What happens when non-Christian teenagers read the Bible with fresh eyes - no church language, no right answers?

Sometimes what they see is uncomfortable. And that's exactly the point.

In Translating God Part 3: Troubling Jesus, we listened to 14 - 18 year olds wrestle with stories we've long called "good news". What emerged wasn't just insight into how young people read Scripture - but how we have shaped the world they're reading it from.

Their questions expose our blind spots. Their interpretations disrupt our defaults. Their honesty challenges the versions of Jesus we've made safe.

This isn't about dumbing things down or tweaking the tone. It's about letting young people be prophets - and letting the Gospel unsettle us again.

Maybe the Church doesn't just have something to offer young people.

Maybe they have something to offer us.

A day for anyone aged 18 to 30 considering ministry in the Church of England. There will be:


- Time for worship, prayer and Bible study
