

# Children's Youth & Families Newsletter Mar 24

Over the past couple of weeks I have had some really good conversations with children and young people about safeguarding and their views on how the church cares about them.

While it was reassuring that some had seen how their church protected them, there were some (younger ones) who couldn't tell me what safeguarding was and others (all ages) who didn't know who to turn to if they had concerns.

I guess it can be easy to assume they know.

But, out of these conversations, they now know who to speak to, they have hung Childline posters where they feel other children and young people can see them if they need help, they understand confidentiality and they've shaped our programmes as they shared the challenges they're facing - with peer pressure, with being able to say "no", with identifying issues in relationships - challenges that they would like our help with, that they are **trusting us to support them** in.

The questions I asked can be found on the Padlet Board under "Safeguarding, Paperwork & Proformas" - can I encourage you to sit with your groups and ask them, too?

The National Safeguarding Team have commissioned resources to support young people and children in safeguarding themselves and their friends. 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## **Choral Church Network**

Last week we gathered at Lincoln Cathedral as a Choral Church Network, from across the Diocese. It was great to celebrate this mission and ministry, the impact it has on so many, and recognise the role it can play in drawing children and young people into the church and their faith formation.

We discussed a possible framework to articulate a common pattern for the development of music and how schools links were often the foundation for engagement with children and young people. We considered pathways and development within the Choral structure, for both singers and organists.

We are looking to work at a Diocesan, in a series of hubs and more locally, where a 'choral church' might make a distinctive contribution to the wider life of the local church family.

At our next meeting, on **4th May in Stamford**, we will consider how a strategy framework might be shaped in our individual contexts, and how it might be resourced for the future, as well as what activities we could promote that would bring together existing singing groups in both local combined services and at a diocesan level.
