Dear Colleagues,

Whilst shops and supermarkets would have us travel rapidly from Christmas to Easter, thanks to the arrival of Easter eggs around Boxing Day, Christians choose to shun that speed, and, rather, move purposefully, but reflectively through Lent, all in preparation for events to come through Holy Week and beyond. One retailer said they display eggs immediately after Christmas because many are looking for treats, supposedly, I guess, to see them through the dark winter months. This seems a weak justification, given the seasonal excesses many will have enjoyed in December. Perhaps it's about selling as much chocolate as possible before it's given up, by many, for 40 days!

Treats, of the right kind and in appropriate measure, are no bad thing, and you won't be surprised to hear my take on what you might treat yourself to in the coming weeks and months: time ... for ongoing personal, discipleship, and vocational development. It's very easy to put off taking time out from the usual routines and responsibilities in your diary, but I'd argue that making space for learning can be a treat for the mind, body and soul.

I recently attended a conference for those new to incumbency/first post of responsibility, where some delegates were saying out loud what I was thinking: 'I've left so much work behind!' 'emails are piling up!' 'Playing catch up will be tough.' All true, but that time spent listening, learning, and sharing, chatting over meals, and more, was another way of refuelling. I was intellectually stimulated and fed, nourished through the prayers and worship led by others, and it was a treat to meet other Christian leaders, hearing of their joys and frustrations, good practice, (and a few horror stories too). Yes, I came back to an overflowing in-tray, but I returned better equipped to attend to what's in there. Take a look at this, and future bulletins, to see how you might treat yourself to learning. And, forgive me if I take a little longer than usual to respond to your call or email; I'm still catching up.



A New Clergy Ministry Development Review (MDR) Process Starting early 2024: Webinar Introductions

MDR should be an empowering and enriching process, an opportunity to reflect before God on your vocation and ministry, and to share the responsibilities of Office and its impact – positive and negative – on who you are as a disciple of Christ and deacon or priest, and on those with whom you most closely share your life; MDR is a spiritual tool for your personal and vocational growth and development.

We have made several significant changes to the process, not least in response to the Covenant for Clergy Care and Wellbeing, ensuring we place questions of how you are as a beloved child of God front and centre, enabling space in which to ask for support for you or your family. Plus, in acknowledgement of our commitment to ministerial collaboration we now offer a list of clergy and lay Reviewers from which you choose who will accompany you in your MDR reflections; their role is to affirm, celebrate, encourage, and empathise with your circumstances and situations, and help you to challenge your thinking, so that you produce clear outcomes that will assist you in your ongoing ministry.

To hear more about the raison d'être, aims, and process of this new iteration of MDR, join The Reverend Jackie Johnson, (Wellbeing and CMD Officer), at one of the monthly webinars planned for December and then monthly throughout 2024. 
Church Buildings Team January Bulletin

- Wrestle with the practicalities of living hopefully in the local church.





Contactless Donation Devices for your Church!

People like to give in different ways and for different reasons to churches across the country, and many churches are indebted to the generosity of those who have chosen to support its presence in a local community. As we increasingly move towards being a cashless society, it is important that churches can receive gifts in the way people find it easiest to give.

The application window is now open for you to apply for one of seventy significantly discounted Contactless Donation Devices that are being offered to churches across the whole Diocese. These devices retail at between £310 and £1,075, but are being offered for the price of just £50, thanks to generous funding from the National Giving Team's Digital Giving Rollout Project.



The purpose of the project is to help make it easier for churches and their supporters to give and receive gifts and to support the local church's mission and ministry financially.

Please note that you don't necessarily need Wi-Fi or a mobile phone signal in your church building in order to have a contactless donation device, as some types are able to store donations offline.

Although we will, naturally, prioritise churches who are new to digital giving, if you have dipped your toe in the water already, but would like to explore alternative or additional contactless donation devices, please do still apply.

You can access the project information pack and application form <u>by visiting this link</u>. The will take you to the Parish Buying landing page entitled 'Lincoln Digital Giving Rollout'. Please read the Information Pack before completing the <u>application form</u>, as this will give you more information about this project and help you to complete the form more accurately, so that we can match the right device to your church's needs.

To access the <u>pack and the application form</u> you will need either to login to your Parish Buying account, or register if you don't have one already. It is free to register, but it can take a couple of days for your account to be verified. More than one person per church can be registered with Parish Buying, so even if someone else in your church is already registered but you are the best person to complete the application form on your church's behalf, it is fine for you to register also.

The application window is open until **9th February 2024**, but please don't leave it to the last minute.





Anna Chaplaincy



A <u>6-week introduction course</u> has been designed for those preparing for a role as Anna Chaplain, covering information about the spirituality of older people and how Anna Chaplaincy responds to spiritual needs in later life. It is a good refresher for those specialising in pastoral care in later life, and also available to those who are already commissioned as Anna Chaplains.

Costs: Currently the course costs £110 inclusive of all training costs, plus £25 (plus £3 P&P) for the Anna Chaplaincy Handbook which is essential reading. There are diocesan funds to support this training to Anna Chaplain or Anna Friend which meet these costs, whether taking on the role in a voluntary or ministerial development capacity.
