# Discovering Growing Discerning Training Continuing March 2024

Dear Colleagues,

Here's a short 'test' which gave me pause for thought. Attributed to Charles Schulz, creator of the 'Peanuts' comic strip, it's offered here with contextual adaptations.

- 1. Name the 5 wealthiest people in the world.
- 2. Name the last 3 Wimbledon women's trophy winners.
- 3. Name the last 3 winners of the Booker Prize.
- 4. Name 4 people who have won the Nobel or Pulitzer Prize.
- 5. Name 5 recent Academy, (Oscar), Award winners for best actor and actress.

A few faces may have come to mind, even some names, but I suspect that a lot of this marvellousness hasn't lodged in your memory bank. That's because, for even those who have been the very best in their fields, the achievements of people we don't know personally are mostly forgotten. Now try these questions.

- 1. Name 5 teachers who helped you in your journey through school, or as a lifelong learner.
- 2. Name 3 people who have informed your life, such to change the way you live it.
- 3. Think of 5 people who have made you feel appreciated and special.
- 4. Name 4 friends, or significant fellow 'travellers on 'The Way', who've helped you through difficult times.
- 5. Think of 5 people with whom you enjoy spending time, people who bring laughter and fun to your life.

Easier? Probably so, because those who really make a difference to us are not those with the most money, or awards. Those who inform our lives such as to change them are generally those who want the best for us, who want to see us flourish and thrive, who want us to become the person God calls us to be. The College of St Hugh team exists to encourage a culture of life-long, cradle to grave, Christian learning; we hope that the work we do, the service we offer, is a help to you personally in your own faith and vocational journey and enables you to help others. Our aim is to provide support and resources to help folks:

- in their **Discovering** of faith, ...
- and in their **Growing** in faith, so that they can better understand the faith they profess, and share it with others ...
- in **Discerning** the way forward and discovering God's baptismal call on their lives ...

As a Team, we'd be delighted if there were Christians in Greater Lincolnshire, who, when asked that second group of questions, brought our names and faces to mind, as people who had made a difference to their life of faith, (feel free to encourage us with emails on how we did that!). But seriously, perhaps a reflective exercise for all of us this Lent might be to give prayerful thanks for those we think of when reading through that second set of questions, people who have impacted our lives for the better, and to ponder on how we engage with ongoing Christian learning such that we are better able to live the life God intends for us, and share the good news of Jesus with others. That way, we might just find ourselves making an appearance on somebody else's list of significant people who have changed their life for the better.

#### A New Clergy Ministry Development Review (MDR) Process Starting early 2024: Webinar Introductions

MDR should be an empowering and enriching process, an opportunity to reflect before God on your vocation and ministry, and to share the responsibilities of Office and its impact – positive and negative – on who you are as a disciple of Christ and deacon or priest, and on those with whom you most closely share your life; MDR is a spiritual tool for your personal and vocational growth and development.

We have made several significant changes to the process, not least in response to the Covenant for Clergy Care and Wellbeing, ensuring we place questions of how you are as a beloved child of God front and centre, enabling space in which to ask for support for you or your family. Plus, in acknowledgement of our commitment to ministerial collaboration we now offer a list of clergy and lay Reviewers from which you choose who will accompany you in your MDR reflections; their role is to affirm, celebrate, encourage, and empathise with your circumstances and situations, and help you to challenge your thinking, so that you produce clear outcomes that will assist you in your ongoing ministry.





## Anna Chaplaincy

A <u>6-week introduction course</u> has been designed for those preparing for a role as Anna Chaplain, covering information about the spirituality of older people and how Anna Chaplaincy responds to spiritual needs in later life. It is a good refresher for those specialising in pastoral care in later life, and also available to those who are already commissioned as Anna Chaplains. Costs: Currently the course costs £110 inclusive of all training costs, plus £25 (plus £3 P&P) for the Anna Chaplaincy Handbook which is essential reading. There are diocesan funds to support this training to Anna Chaplain or Anna Friend which meet these costs, whether taking on the role in a voluntary or ministerial development capacity. This online course, conducted within a supportive cohort, will assist recognised church leaders/clergy to evaluate their critical change challenges, engage with recent organisational change practice and equip with tools and perspectives for faithful and strategic responses. The course is accredited at Masters level (10 credits) by the University of Glasgow. It costs £499 and there can be CMD assistance of £250 towards the fee.

#### The latest Living Ministry research report, 'Holding Things Together: Church of England Clergy in Changing Times'

This new report was recently published and provides an update on clergy wellbeing as experienced by the participants in our longitudinal study. Based on survey data collected in March 2023, the report examines how different aspects of wellbeing have changed since previous waves of the research and through the pandemic, as well as exploring for the first time in Living Ministry how clergy experience and manage change. Other new questions address social class and cultural and
