General information about the Parish Safeguarding Officer role

What is a PSO and what is their role?

The PSO is the key link between the diocese and the parish. The tole can be one or more individuals. The key tasks of the PSO are as follows:

- Keep a record of all church activities involving children and vulnerable adults;
- Attend any diocesan safeguarding training offered for PSOs;
- Promote inclusivity within a church community;
- Liaise with incumbents and the Diocesan Safeguarding Advisor (DSA);
- Report any concerns/allegations against church officers to the DSA;
- Report to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) more than once annually, to ensure safeguarding issues are discussed and reported to the annual Parochial Church meeting. Safeguarding should be discussed at every PCC meeting;
- Keep clear, accurate and up to date records of recruitment, DBS checks and safeguarding training;
- Keep the church leadership informed of good safeguarding practice;
- Promote safeguarding training in the parish;
- Ensure that the 'Promoting a Safer Church' poster is clear and easily accessible to everyone, with complete, up to date contact details on it;
- Keet accurate records of any safeguarding concerns that arise, keeping the records confidential, and ensuring that others do the same;
- Be familiar with diocesan safeguarding guidance and ensure that any leaders of activities are fully aware of, and are implementing, this guidance;
- Undertake a regular parish safeguarding self-assessment through the Parish Safeguarding Dashboard.

Safer Recruitment and People Management information

This training can be completed online and is for all those involved in the recruitment, selection and management of staff or volunteers. The aim is to equip participants with an understanding of safer recruitment, and the skills and practices necessary to promote positive safeguarding behaviour (and detect safeguarding risk) once a person is in role.

Completion of this training is a requirement for a number of roles under House of Bishops guidance including:

- Line managers and anyone involved in the recruitment of Church Officers (employees, elected members, and volunteers).
- Those with responsibility for administering DBS.
- Safeguarding Officers in all Church bodies.

Safeguarding Dashboard

The Diocese of Lincoln gives all parishes access to their own personal safeguarding dashboard. The dashboard uses a traffic light colour system to help parishes track their safeguarding compliance across a series of safeguarding aspect.

Model Parish Safeguarding Officer Role Description

The Parish Safeguarding Officer is the key link between the diocese and the parish/s, concerning safeguarding matters. She/he will have an overview of all church activities involving children, young people and vulnerable adults and will seek to ensure the implementation of safeguarding policy. The role can be taken by one person, or the role shared, for example with one person covering children and the other vulnerable adults.

The key tasks of the parish safeguarding officer are to:

- 1. Have an overview of all church activities involving children and vulnerable adults and keep a record of these activities.
- 2. Be familiar with diocesan safeguarding guidance and ensure that leaders of activities are fully aware of, and are implementing, this guidance.
- 3 Liaise with the incumbent over safeguarding issues.
- 4. Keep in touch with the leaders of all activities and offer them advice and support over safeguarding matters.
- 5. Liaise as necessary with the Diocesan Safeguarding Advisers. Report all concerns or allegations against church officers to the DSA.
- 6. Attend diocesan safeguarding training offered for PSOs.
- 7. Assist with safeguarding training in the parish as appropriate.
- 8. Attend a meeting of the church leadership (PCC) at least annually to ensure safeguarding issues are discussed and that the church leadership adopt the annual Church Safeguarding Policy.
- 9. Ensure that the Church Safeguarding Policy and contact details is displayed in all Church premises.
- 10. Keep good records of any safeguarding concerns that may arise and ensure that others do the same.
- 11. Promote inclusiveness in places of worship and within church activities.
- 12. Keep the church leadership informed of good safeguarding practice.
- 13. Undertake a regular parish safeguarding self-assessment in the format offered by the Diocese.


