Continuing in Faith We recently held the Lay Ministers Retreat at Launde Abbey for ALMs and Readers, at which I spent some time offering a session on wellbeing. It was a wonderful experience, not because of what I said or did, but because of everyone's enthusiastic engagement both with the material and fellow ministerial colleagues, because of the discussion and general buzz in the room, and the laughter too; people were obviously happy to be together. I wish I could have stayed longer, it was a real pick-me-up. Please invite me back next time!

I shouldn't be surprised that Christians were enjoying time together, but, well, we are quite good at concealing our appreciation of and love for our sisters and brothers in Christ. Sometimes, an atmosphere of pessimism pervades which can be a bit of a challenge; we're good at accentuating the negative and failing to acknowledge the positive in each other. But, when we do stop, and immerse ourselves in God and give attention to each other, we unexpectedly stumble upon an affinity, a kinship, which is hugely attractive to those seeking a place of friendship and belonging. My short glimpse into the Lay Ministers Retreat – this place of prayerful reflection and learning – was enough to make me think that, had someone been looking in for a company of which to be a part, one in which they could see and experience God's love for them, one which evidenced an enthusiasm for the faith, and for ministerial vocation, then this event would have drawn them through the doors to ask, 'Can I join you?'

Ultimately, part of our job as Christians is to exercise our faith in such a way that we help to make God tangible, visible, knowable. In John 13: 34-35, we hear Jesus say, 'I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (NRSV). So, in your gathering for prayer and worship, in your times of learning about the faith you profess, in your times of seeking and reflection, I pray you may experience something of what I found at the Lay Ministers Retreat – something that's a real tonic for you, and enticing enough for others to say, 'Can I join in?'



#### **Bishops Social Justice Fund:**

#### **Funding for Warm Spaces:**

We are thrilled to announce that the government is launching a £76 million Cost of Living Fund for community organisations —including warm spaces— this winter. The fund is called <u>The Community Organisations Cost of Living Fund</u> and is delivered by the <u>Community Fund</u>.

Spaces can apply for funding between £10,000 and £75,000. The timing of the fund, with resource available to cover operations from October 2023 to March 2024, lines up with our forthcoming Warm Welcome Campaign.

# Grant opportunity: Community and Environmental Projects

Deadline: 05-10-2023 Find out more

The Veolia Environmental Trust, which provides grant for community and environmental projects, has announced that the next funding round will open on the 31 August 2023 until the 12 noon on the 5th October 2023.

- Community Grants: Open to constituted not-for-profit organizations and local authorities. They provide funding ranging from £10,000 to £75,000, aimed at creating or improving buildings or outdoor spaces for the benefit of the community. The maximum project size eligible for funding is £350,000.
- Habitat and Biodiversity Grants: Projects focused on conserving, restoring, or enhancing threatened habitats and/or protecting and increasing biodiversity can apply for grants between £10,000 and £75,000.
- Environmental Improvement Grants: For landscapescale improvement projects, such as habitat creation/management and species protection, grants exceeding £75,000 are available.

### **Ready for School Grants:**

The Bishop of Lincoln's Ready For School Fund aims to support schoolchildren who are lacking the things they need in order to access confidently the full life of school and the curriculum.

Application guidance

- for small grants of no more than around £100 for individual children
- administered at no cost by the LDTBF

### Christian Aid Emergency Appeal for Libya






# Nature in Lincolnshire: what matters most to you? Public Survey

That's why we've launched our "Do One Thing" campaign to coincide with Anti Slavery Day this October!


