Discovering Faith

September 2023

Dear Colleagues

Growing in Faith We hope you've been able to find space during these summer weeks for rest, relaxation and renewal, at home or away. September is the month when things that had been put down are taken up again; so, if you have had a more fallow August, life probably takes off anew here, and there's the temptation to hit the ground running, (though I appreciate some never stopped).

We should remember, however, amid the busyness, our ongoing need for rest, refreshment, and renewal, the need for Sabbath time. The biblical idea of Sabbath was revolutionary. No other society had mandated a day on which human beings were to refrain from their normal labour, and we should approach the Sabbath as good news to the (time) poor, providing release (from the bonds of productivity), recovery (to those debilitated by the daily grind), and freedom (from what controls or dominates).

Discerning in Faith I'd argue too that we should seek Sabbath time more than once a week, and, in addition, finding Sabbath, i.e. moments of renewal of mind, body, and spirit, in every day. A while ago, whilst travelling to work, mentally preparing for a challenging conversation and pretty subdued in spirit, I looked at the road ahead and saw a bird of prey hovering above a bridge. It was directly in front of me, and almost cruciform in shape, majestic in its skilled stillness. I don't know why, but in that moment of seeing, my perspective on the day ahead shifted, completely changed. The same problematic conversation awaited me, but now approached it in a different mind-set. Whilst I'm sure the mouse over which the bird was hovering didn't have much of a sense of wellbeing, I did. I felt blessed, and have come to describe what happened as a 'Sabbath Moment' - a moment of renewal of mind and spirit, a time of transformation. The word Sabbath means, in part, to cease or desist, and in that moment, I stopped mentally working, or working out what to do and say, and was simply moved by beauty into a new state of mind.

Training For Faith

Can you identify any recent sabbath moments - those unexpected events that change the tone of the day, reframe it? Is there something you might intentionally include in your life each day, or at least more than once a week, that could bring refreshment of mind and spirit sufficient to create even just a moment or two of renewal? Do you allow enough space in your day to allow those sabbath moments to register? It's my hope that this September, and through all that the autumn months will bring, you will experience Sabbath Moments – short sabbaticals – in every day, planned an unforeseen.

Transformation Fund:

This Fund provides grants to help churches launch new missional initiatives or significantly develop existing projects that will help transform lives across greater Lincolnshire.

Tier 1 (up to £500) always open to applications.

Tier 2 Grants available from £501 to a maximum of £20,000 within any one year.

Grants of up to £2500 can be applied for from the Bishops Social Justice Fund to resource any great work happening in Greater Lincolnshire. <u>Apply here</u>.

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Funding for Warm Spaces

We are thrilled to announce that the government is launching a £76 million Cost of Living Fund for community organisations —including warm spaces— this winter. The fund is called <u>The Community Organisations Cost of Living Fund</u> and is delivered by the <u>Community Fund</u>.

Spaces can apply for funding between £10,000 and £75,000. The timing of the fund, with resource available to cover operations from October 2023 to March 2024, lines up with our forthcoming Warm Welcome Campaign.

Grant opportunity: Community and Environmental Projects Deadline: 05-10-2023 <u>Find out more</u>

The Veolia Environmental Trust, which provides grant for community and environmental projects, has announced that the next funding round will open on the 31 August 2023 until the 12 noon on the 5th October 2023.

- Community Grants: Open to constituted not-for-profit organizations and local authorities. They provide funding ranging from £10,000 to £75,000, aimed at creating or improving buildings or outdoor spaces for the benefit of the community. The maximum project size eligible for funding is £350,000.
- Habitat and Biodiversity Grants: Projects focused on conserving, restoring, or enhancing threatened habitats and/or protecting and increasing biodiversity can apply for grants between £10,000 and £75,000.
- Environmental Improvement Grants: For landscape-scale improvement projects, such as habitat creation/management and species protection, grants exceeding £75,000 are available.

Ready for School Grants:

The Bishop of Lincoln's Ready For School Fund aims to support schoolchildren who are lacking the things they need in order to access confidently the full life of school and the curriculum.

Application guidance

- for small grants of no more than around £100 for individual children
- administered at no cost by the LDTBF






This journey follows the Church of England lectionary (list of weekly Bible readings). Its vision is to connect God's word with God's world by inspiring and nurturing everyday faith.

Anna Chaplaincy

A 6-week introduction course has been designed for those preparing for a role as Anna Chaplain, covering information about the spirituality of older people and how Anna Chaplaincy responds to spiritual needs in later life. It is a good refresher for those specialising in pastoral care in later life, and also available to those who are already commissioned as Anna Chaplains. There is a maximum group size of 14, to allow learners to contribute to discussions and get to know each other.

Social Prescribing describes how health care providers might refer patients suffering from things like stress or loneliness to non-clinical services to benefit their wellbeing.


Disability Matters newsletter



This ecumenical Season of Creation that begins with the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation on September 1st and culminates on October 4th, celebrating the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. This year the theme is "Let justice and peace flow", guided by the prophet Amos who cries out, "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (5: 24). We are encouraged to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and biodiversity loss.

"A mighty river" is the symbol chosen to go with this theme, representing biodiversity at risk. The urgency grows and we must make visible **peace** with Earth and on Earth, at the same time that justice calls us to **repentance** and a change of **attitude** and **actions**. When we join the river of justice and peace together with others, it creates **hope** instead of despair.
