The audit is essential for working out which measures are most effective for your own church. Parish Buying - Energy Audit - you have to be logged into Parish Buying for the link. Cost: £200- £300

Take Action:

Work through the <u>Cofe Practical Path to Net Zero for Churches</u> checklist. This will take you through the actual energy reduction measures needed. Review the Cofe <u>National Routemap 2030</u>, <u>Milestones for churches</u>. Make a plan for your church based on this guidance. *Cost: Your Time and cost of change*
